Public offices and private citizens, including two prominent Albany lawyers, have voiced opposition to the planned razing of three early 19th Century buildings on Elk Street to make way for a new headquarters for the New York State Bar Association.

The forum was a heating conducted last night by the Hudson River Valley Commission at the Joseph Henry Mamorial in Academy Park.

Alexander Aldrich, executive director of the state agency and cousin of Governor Rockefeller, c a r e f u l l y explained that the commission can only delay for 30 days the demolition of the buildings at 2, 3, and 4 Kile Street, owned by the bar association.

The commission will make recommendations but the har association can Yollow or ignore them, said Mr. Aldrich, explaining that the commission has only "advisory" powers. The hearing, he said, was "primarily educational."

Mayor Corning said the city is powerless to half the destruction, but added 'I believe public opinion can and should be marshaled to save these three buildings."
