### Environmental & Energy Law Section EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING May 19, 2021

#### **Approval of October 22, 2020 Executive Committee Minutes**

- Motion to approve by W. Mugdan, seconded by G. Port
- Minutes approved with no objection.

#### **Treasurers Report** (J. Rigano)

- Report on 2020 income (approx. \$48,000) and expenses (approx. \$8,500) to date
- Section still has a surplus of approx. \$63,000.

#### Membership Status & Initiatives (M. Hecker)

- Issue with NYSBA renewal process for 2021. If not renewed by April 1, 2021, then members automatically dropped. Triggered need for Section outreach to dropped members, which N. Ward-Willis has drafted. Still waiting for list of specific members that have been dropped.
- 746 members as of April 2021. Hoping numbers will increase once dropped members receive targeted outreach.
- Numbers lower than normal, likely due to pandemic as well as NYSBA automatic dropping.
- Still trending heavy with older attorneys.
- Committee actively working to increase membership.
  - Pushing law student numbers with recent law school panel, outreach to law professors and better/earlier advertising to law students.
- Discussed other membership initiatives including targeting energy attorneys.

#### Fall Meeting (L. Shaw)

- NYSBA policy for in-person meetings in packet.
- Cabinet has preliminarily voted to have fall meeting in-person at the Statler Hotel in Ithaca.
- Discussed logistics and possible coordination Municipal Law Section and the need to make financial commitments soon.
- Will look for people to register early to determine interest levels.
- Target dates of October 22-24<sup>th</sup>.
- Agenda still fluid so ideas can be sent to L. Shaw.

#### Climate Change Blog (C. Howard)

- Update given, including outreach to all other NYSBA sections to determine their interest in receiving the Blog. Now, there are 18 NYSBA Sections receiving the Blog.
- A new blog entry forthcoming. Lots of options for material given Biden Administration.
- Discussed possibility of broadening distribution of Blog (e.g., ABA, other states' bar associations).

#### Green Amendment (K. Kuh)

- Update given on Green Amendment to State Constitution and upcoming vote this Fall.
- Encouraged discussing Green Amendment with others to garner support.
- Available as a resource to get the word out for the Green Amendment.
- June 9<sup>th</sup> Facebook live presentation. Details to follow in Section message board..
- Section previously supported Green Amendment. Discussed history with NYSBA Executive Committee. Section no longer allowed to support given NYSBA rule on not supporting/opposing ballot initiatives.

# 2022 Diversity & Inclusion **Fellowship**

## The Fellowship

- > \$7,500 stipend to spend the summer of 2022 (8 weeks minimum) working on legal matters for a government environmental or energy agency or public interest environmental organization in New York State. (The applicant need not have identified a summer internship prior to applying for the fellowship. After a 2022 fellowship awardee has been selected, members of the Section can assist the awardee in searching for a summer internship placement.)
- > Invitation to a meeting of the NYSBA's Environmental & Energy Law Section
- > Assignment of a mentor from the environmental or energy bar

### **Eligibility**

First-year, second-year, and third-year (night students only) underrepresented group members who are: 1) enrolled in a law school in New York State; or 2) permanent New York State residents, and enrolled in a law school in the United States. Underrepresented group members are persons who are: African American, Latinx, Native American, Alaskan native, Asian, Pacific Islander, LGBTQ+.

All applicants must be a member of NYSBA and the Environmental & Energy Law Section. Membership is free for law students.

### **Fellowship Criteria**

Interest in environmental and/or energy issues; strong academic record (undergraduate and/or law school); outstanding personal qualities; and leadership abilities. (A law school course in environmental or energy law is not a prerequisite.)

- > Law school transcript
- > Essay describing applicant's interest in environmental or energy issues
- > Reasons for wanting to participate in the Fellowship
